Charge: The Endocrine Surgery Section has the goal of becoming the premier organization for all surgeons with an interest in Head and Neck Endocrine Surgery while improving patient care, research and education in this arena.

AHNS Thyroid Cancer Survivors' Association Award for Thyroid Cancer Research Grant -Candidates for this award should reside in the U.S. or Canada and be AHNS members in good standing. They may be medical students focusing in otolaryngology, otolaryngology residents, PhDs or faculty members in otolaryngology departments. Preference will be given to early-stage investigators (10 years or less from a terminal degree or fellowship training) or more experienced researchers pursuing a new line of inquiry for which pilot data are needed. Previous AHNS or AAO-HNS Foundation research grant recipients are eligible to compete for this grant. However, candidates who have successfully obtained funding from a private or federal funding agency for the same research are ineligible. Candidates who have applied for support of the same research from other funding sources, and who are notified of an award from both another agency and from AHNS must choose only one of the awards. Applications submitted by ineligible PIs will NOT be reviewed by the CORE Study Section.

The Letters of Intent (LOI) for the Grants are due by **11:59 EST on Friday**, **December 15, 2023**

AHNS-ES engagement and advocacy for our specialty: CPT CODES FOR ABLATION AND RUC VALUATION

The AHNS ES has worked with leaders from AAOHNS and joined by other organizations with an interest stake (Radiology, General Surgery, Endocrinology) to promote participation in the approved survey as well as providing estimates of standard equipment and supply costs for practices engaged in thyroid ablation. Thanks to section members who willingly provided anonymized data from their practices for this effort. Dear AHNS Endocrine Surgery Section Member:

You have been selected to participate in an AMA RUC survey of the following new CPT codes related to Percutaneous Radiofrequency (RF) Thyroid Ablation.

6XX01 Ablation of 1 or more thyroid nodule(s), one lobe or the isthmus, percutaneous, including imaging guidance, radiofrequency

+6XX02 Ablation of 1 or more thyroid nodule(s), additional lobe, percutaneous, with imaging guidance, radiofrequency (List separately in addition to code for primary service)

As you may know, the Medicare payment schedule is based on physician work, practice expense, and professional liability insurance. Our society needs your help to assure relative values will be accurately and fairly presented to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. This survey is estimated to take 15-30 minutes. You may save your answers and access the survey at a later time so long as you utilize the same computer to login to the survey.




